The Service provides information and support to victims and witnesses sent in the form of a notice with a call for procedural actions of examining witnesses, which states that the above can be protected by being granted the status of protected or vulnerable witness if there are legitimate safety concerns after an assessment based on the available information.

The primary task of the Service is to provide psychological and logistical assistance and support to witnesses, as well as to enable witnesses to access the court or some other procedural body as easily and efficiently as possible, and for that purpose, the Service has been assigned a special telephone line and e-mail address: 011/3082-557;

#### **NOTE: INFORMATION FOR WITNESSES AND VICTIMS**

As a **witness** in criminal proceedings, you have an extremely important role in clarifying and proving a criminal offense. Your testimony and cooperation with the judiciary as a witness can be of great importance in criminal proceedings. You can learn more about the rights and responsibilities of witnesses (Article 91-112 of the Criminal Procedure Code) from an excerpt from the Code on the back of this information sheet or from the entire version on the portal of the Republic Public Prosecutor: **[www.rjt.gov.rs](http://www.rjt.gov.rs)**.

If you have reasons to be justifiably concerned about your safety as a witness or your participation in criminal proceedings as a witness is particularly difficult for justified reasons, there is a possibility that the prosecutor may request basic protection, assign protected witness or vulnerable witness status (see Code excerpt). Please mention this during your meeting with the OWCP employee who in turn will inform you in detail about these possibilities.

If you are a **victim** in a criminal proceeding, you have certain additional rights – Article 50-63 of the CPC (see excerpt or **[www.rjt.gov.rs](http://www.rjt.gov.rs)**). In order to exercise your rights as a victim in criminal proceedings and to inform yourself about the case, you can schedule a visit to the Office of the War Crimes Prosecution via the above contact telephone numbers and e-mail address of this Service.
